- * International Men's Day: November 19 is celebrated as International Men's Day. This day was first observed on November 19, 1999. The purpose of this day is not to talk about men's rights but to draw attention to men's health rights. Islam is a religion of justice and equality. Just as Islam has

- * Human Rights Day: Human Rights Day is celebrated around the world on December 10. The United Nations raised the voice of human rights six decades ago today, but the Prophet of Islam formally introduced human rights fourteen centuries ago and gave a practical example. Farewell Sermon And the exemplary manifesto is great. It has the honor of being the first manifesto of human rights in the light of historical facts. On the occasion of his first and last Hajj in Dhi Qa'dah 2 AH, Aqasali pointed out all the rights of mankind in front of one hundred and twenty four thousand or one hundred and forty four thousand Companions.
